## Need cash? Samaritans to the rescue


ong queues at the bank and ATMs running out of cash in no time — in this time of demonetisation, some people are sharing what we need most: new currency.

Call it the power of social media, people are sending out tweets and Facebook posts, offering assistance to those in dire need of some quick cash for basic amenities or a medical emergency.
"If anybody need some cash

in and around South Delhi. you can message me, I can help you out, believe me I know the struggle (sic)," read a Facebook post by Pankaj Upadhyay. "If you're stuck in an emergency and need cash for medicines in Gurgaon? I would be happy to help!," tweeted Abhishek Tripathi. Anish Sharma, a city resident shares: "I had

days. So, I offered a sum of ₹200 to 10 people." And this is encouraging many more. "l saw people offering help. So I, too, offered 23 notes of ₹100 each to those who needed it urgently. In Sector 40 market, I saw senior citizens struggling to exchange their notes. So I gave them cash, in exchange of their old ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes," savs Aditva Dariva, a corporate from Gurgaon. Here's someone who

received help. "I was moving to Delhi from Chandigarh and I had no cash with me. I posted about this on a help group on Facebook, and a gentleman gave me ₹4,000 in cash. I transferred the amount online to his account. It's great to see that people you don't even know are helping each other,' says chef Richa Johri.
